


This week has been anti-bullying week. We began the week with Odd Socks Day, to encourage children to express themselves and celebrate

individuality. The theme has been "One kind word", helping

us to value the importance of kindness, whether it is us being kind ourselves or receiving kindness from others. Children have also learnt about being an

"Upstander" rather than a "Bystander", reinforcing our message that we are all responsible for keeping each other safe. As a school, the anti-bullying message is every week of the year. We are proud holders of the Surrey Silver anti-bullying charter mark for the work we have done to ensure bullying is not tolerated at Holly Lodge. This is led by Mrs Watson, our anti-bullying champion, and our committee made up of parents, staff and a school Governor.



Today has been Times Tables Rockstars day! Please do encourage your child to practise their times tables and number skills at home (Numbots). There is a national statutory Times Table check that all children complete in year 4. The more practice children have, the more confident children become with maths. Also, may I give a reminder of the importance of daily reading at home and recording it in the reading record. Reading really does make a difference to all areas of the curriculum and to your child's outcomes.

<u>Covid Testing and Symptoms – Reminder</u>

The three main symptoms are:

- a new, persistent cough
- change in sense of smell or taste
- raised temperature

Even if your child displays only one of these symptoms, you will still need to arrange a test. We would like to remind parents that lateral flow device (LFD) tests are not designed for use when children are displaying Covid symptoms. These are designed for asymptomatic testing only and cannot be used in lieu of a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test. Unfortunately, we cannot accept symptomatic pupils back to school unless they have a negative PCR test. If pupils develop symptoms during the school day, parents will be contacted.


