Christmas Events

Tuesday 14th December – Class Parties

Please could your child bring in their own, named, personal plate/tub of party food, as there will be no sharing, for their class Christmas party. **The party food is in addition to lunch; please keep it separate**

from packed lunches. Please could we remind you not to include any items which may contain nuts. Pupils are also allowed to wear mufti on this day. Party clothes are allowed but please ensure that they wear suitable footwear and clothing appropriate for the weather. Class parties take place during the school day.

Wednesday 15th December – Festive Lunch and Christmas Jumper Day

The cost for the Christmas lunch is £2.45 for Juniors, unless your child is entitled to free school meals. Pupils in Infant Classes are entitled to free meals under the Government's Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme. School lunches must be paid for in advance, therefore parents must ensure that sufficient credit is added to your child's dinner money account. We will not be able to provide a meal on the day without prior payment. Payment is online only via your child's Scopay account. We cannot accept cash payment. To make lunch a bit more special, **pupils bringing in a packed lunch may like to include added festive extras to their lunchbox,** such as mince pies! (on this day, normal packed lunch rules will be relaxed—but **please, nothing containing nuts)**

If you did not complete the online form to inform us of your child's Christmas lunch choice, please send them into school on the day with a packed lunch. The kitchen are unable to provide Christmas dinners that haven't been pre-ordered
