Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for your continued support in keeping us Covid safe at school. As you may be aware, the national guidelines for isolation have now changed. Please see the information below and click on the link for the Government information.

It was lovely to be able to return to having children in the hall for assemblies where possible this week. We are limiting the numbers in the hall and still being cautious. If we have an outbreak, we will put our contingency plan in place.

Our new eco-council, made up from children from Year 2-6, are hard at work, working in conjunction with Surrey County Council on a safer travel plan. They are currently



auditing the school site and the local area, focussing on parking, access, routes to school and facilities. Mia said, "We need new cycle and scooter stands because the ones we have are broken". Dhian said, "We need new scooter and bike parking so we can encourage more people to scoot

and cycle to school." The children are very keen to be able to make a difference.

On Saturday 5^{th} February, we plan to hold a "Ground Force" morning from 9.00-12.00 to prepare our allotment for the spring. We invite families to come and



join us for all or part of the morning. It will mainly be weeding and tidying the site, leaf clearance etc. We also are creating a tiered garden using recycled tyres. If you are able to come, you will need to dress warmly, bring gardening gloves and tools such as small hand tools and a rake (we do have some equipment). We are also after cardboard to recycle and use as a weed membrane. I will provide bacon rolls and hot drinks. Please email the office so we have an idea of numbers. Please see Mr Morgan for more details. It will be subject to the weather and any future Covid restrictions.

Covid-19 Updated Guidance

Removal of confirmatory PCR tests

Anyone, including pupils, who now receives a positive lateral flow test but has no COVID-19 symptoms will no longer have to take a PCR to confirm the result. This became effective from Tuesday 11 January.

Changes to self-isolation

From Monday 17 January, people with COVID-19 in England can end their self-isolation after 5 full days, as long as they test negative on a LFD on day 5 and day 6.
