Dear Parents and Carers

This week we have welcomed in our new Reception children and parents. We are delighted to have so many new families joining our Holly Lodge community. We have been able to settle the children into school in small groups and already we see little friendships forming. The children in the other year groups are settling in well and it is so good to be able to once again resume teamwork and collaboration now we are not restricted to "bubbles". Next week we will hold our first assemblies. To reduce the number of children in the hall, the same assembly will be run twice. Our Monday assembly is always based on our school REACH values. This half term, we are focussing on Respect. Our word of the week this week linked with respect is listening. Our school values are for life not just for Holly Lodge, so do speak to your child and ask them about the weekly value.

"Memma the cave woman" visited the Year 3 pupils today to teach the children how our ancestors lived. They learned many things, including how to light fires, forage for food and hunt for signs of animal life. They also had the opportunity to come to school dressed up in their Stone Age costumes and taste some meat and game! It has been a fantastic day, which has really enhanced the pupil's learning of the topic.
