Usually after Easter, children would be preparing for national SATs tests in year 2 and 6; phonics screening in Year 1; the Multiplication Check in year 4. The Government has cancelled

all national testing and reporting this year. In school, we will be doing a variety of assessments but these will be used internally to support teacher assessment to identify gaps and plan going forward to support children in making up any lost learning. There will not be an Easter report this year but we will be holding parent consultation evenings remotely as we did in the autumn where teachers will report verbally on how your child has settled and any areas where you can support at home. 
