It has been so important for us to have the children back in school and we want them to remain in school. As measures ease, we will be reviewing our risk assessments, but please could I urge you all to still remain careful. I would like to draw your attention to the important information below regarding pupil testing and isolation — especially with the guidance on use of the LFD home tests, as well as our test and trace procedure for the Easter holidays.

We are so proud of our children for the way they have adapted and settled back into school this term. We have used a strength-based approach looking at the positives and how we use what we have learnt to support well-being and learning.

Comic Relief update — I am excited to bring you an updated total, raised from online and cash donations.... £1,017! This is the most we have ever raised for Comic Relief. Care has been the focus in the teaching of our Holly Lodge values this term and it is important that we teach the children to look outside of themselves to care for others. The generosity of our families shows this care in action. Thank you!

Important Pupil Testing and Isolation for Parents

As schools have now returned to full attendance, we understand parents' frustration when their child is asked to isolate at home either after testing positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), or because of being in close contact of someone who has tested positive. However self-isolation is one of the most important things we can do to help stop the spread of the virus and help protect our friends, family and our community. Around one in three people with coronavirus (COVID-19) have no symptoms, and so finding and isolating these hidden cases quickly will help to stop outbreaks before they get a chance to develop.

We are pleased that so far we haven't had to close any class bubbles at Holly Lodge and want to keep it that way. If your child displays any of the Covid symptoms, you will need to arrange a Covid test. I realise that this may inconvenience parents, but by doing this you are protecting all of our children and our families.

We would like to remind parents that lateral flow device (LFD) tests are not sufficient for use when children are displaying Covid symptoms. These are designed for asymptomatic testing only and cannot be used in lieu of a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test. Unfortunately we cannot accept symptomatic pupils back to school unless they have a negative PCR test.

Holly Lodge staff are following guidance and therefore, please could I ask you all to treat all members of staff with respect if you are advised to keep your child at home or arrange a test. I know it is frustrating if your child cannot come into school but please do not take out your frustration on the staff. If you do need to speak to the office, please telephone or email, as we need to keep the number of visitors in the building to a minimum.

Easter Holidays Test and Trace

Schools have been asked to assist with test and trace for the first 6 days of the Easter break. As school will be closed for the holidays, the telephone lines won't be manned. Therefore we ask that you contact us by email: info@hollylodge.kite.academy

Please title your email "Pupil Covid-19 Test and Trace". We ask that you include the following:

- Your child's name
- Your child's class
- The last date they attended school
- Your contact telephone number

The inbox for this email address will be checked each morning and afternoon between **Thursday 1**st **and Tuesday 6**th **April**. Please note that you may not receive an immediate reply, but we will respond to you as soon as possible. (Email enquiries relating to anything else other than Pupil Covid-19 Test and Trace will be responded to when school reopens on 19th April)

Reminder

When bringing forms with payment, especially loose cash, into school (for example those who are signing up to the new clubs that are starting after Easter) we ask that you please put it in an envelope before handing it in. Please also include your child's name and class on the front. Thank you.

School Dinners

We have been informed by Surrey County Council that the price of paid pupil meals will increase by 5p to £2.45 from September. If your financial circumstances have changed and you believe your child may be entitled to free meals, please contact the school office for a Pupil Premium form. Pupils in YR - Y2 remain entitled to subsidised meals under the Government Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme.
