Please ensure you have booked your parent telephone consultation appointment for next week with individual teachers. If you require a longer or face-to-face meeting, contact individual teachers via the office. All staff have identified gaps (and strengths) in learning over lockdown and will share how you can support your child in our partnership.

Your partnership with us is very important as we minimise the impact of lockdown. The priority area of need is **reading comprehension** – as this supports all areas of the curriculum including writing and maths. We ask every parent in <u>every</u> year group to commit to hearing their child read/sharing a story 5 times every week. This makes such a difference. It is not just about just learning to read the words but engaging in conversation about the book (e.g. characters, setting, themes, context, vocabulary).

Also, please encourage regular practice of maths fluency: times tables, number bonds and practical maths activities (e.g. weighing/measuring ingredients, money/fractions when sharing sweets/pizza). Encourage regular practice on Times Table Rockstars. These are areas of learning that only improve by regular practice — but make such a difference to children's progress, as these are the tools which are the gateway to unlocking learning at a higher level. A daily investment of 20-30 minutes of time with your child will pay huge dividends as your child moves up the school. We want every child to have the best life chances.

Streaming songs with explicit lyrics. Watching videos featuring adult themes or bad language. Downloading apps or games that they're not quite old enough for yet. When a child uses a smartphone – either their own or a parent's – there are all kinds of harmful content they could unlock, either through natural inquisitiveness or by sheer accident.

The parental controls you'll find on most smartphones are an excellent way of minimising this possibility. They don't completely remove the element of risk — but they do significantly reduce it. The attached guides explain the process of setting up these filters on iPhone and Android devices.


