### Lateness Reminder

Please be aware that registers are legal documents and therefore pupil lateness is also recorded. Pupils should be in the classroom ready for registration at 8.50am. If they arrive between 8.50am and 9.10am this is classed as an “L – Late, before registers closed” code. For arrivals after 9.10am this is recorded as a “U – Late, after registers closed”. Late codes are monitored by the Kite Inclusion Welfare Officer and Surrey Education Welfare Officer. For safeguarding reasons, pupils arriving late must be signed in at the school office by their grown up.
