Sports Day Information – Thursday 30th June

We are excited to announce our sports day will be returning this year and we will be able to invite parents and guardians into school to join us. Our Sports day will be the morning of **Thursday 30th June 2022** and in the event of any weather issues, our reserve day will be the morning of 1st July 2022.

Sports day will involve a carousal of sporting activities on the school field. There will be an area on the field where parents and guardians can stand. The children will move around the arena, whilst scoring points for their team house. Once the carousal sporting activities have finished, we will then have some competitive races on the track. These races will involve the top 4 boy runners and the top 4 girl runners from each class. The children will race against the class in their year group for some competitive fun. To establish the faster runners in each class, the class teachers will be carrying out running races in their PE lessons.

We are very fortunate to have Kings International Sports Leaders with us for the morning, helping us with our sports carousal activities. Please see below details of the morning events. Please also bear in mind that times may differ slightly on the day.

- Children come to school in correct PE uniform and can wear house colour T Shirts
- Please make sure your child has a water bottle for the day and sun hat if we are due to have good weather.
 Please make sure your child has sun cream applied for the day please be aware Holly Lodge staff cannot put sun cream on your child
- If your child is unable to participate in sports day, please make sure a letter is sent in with your child on the day. All children who are unable to participate will wear a high viz jacket for the event and stay within the First Aid station under the sail on the playground
- School registration as normal at 8.50am
- Parents/ Guardians arrive and go onto field to the designated area by 9.15am. Toilets will be available in the M1 unit so please follow signs.
- Children to arrive onto year 5/6 playground by 9.15am in their teams ready to move onto the field for their activities
- Once the sports carousel activities have finished, we will move over to the race track for our competitive fun races
- Once all the scores are added we will announce the house winner of the year
- Finally, when our sports day has ended, Holly Lodge staff will move the children back to the year 5/6 playground, where they will get back into their classes with class teacher and then move back inside in preparation for lunch.
- Pre-school children may be brought along but please ensure you supervise them at all times and keep them away from the children competing. No parents may cross into the children's competing area.
- We would please ask parents/guardians to leave the school site once we have moved all the children back into the school. This should be hopefully be around 11.45am
