Dear Parents and Carers

Today we were pleased to welcome Michael Gove to Holly Lodge. He was able to see how we have supported our pupils to recover lost learning as a result of the pandemic. He particularly commented on our excellent library facilities and how we promote Reading for Pleasure. He also saw children enjoying their golf day and was interested to see the impact of how we use our Sports Premium funding.



This week we had class move-up day. All children have now spent time in their class for September. We are delighted that we are fully staffed for September. Staff are currently working together to support transition for children as they move to their new year class.

On Monday 12<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July, lost property will be put out on tables on the year group playgrounds (weather permitting). Any items that are unclaimed will be donated or disposed of accordingly at the end of term.

Please can I remind you once again about safe parking around the school. Please also respect our neighbours. There is no parking in Meadow Close or Cordelia Gardens.

The Government have announced a relaxation of restrictions if the country moves to step 4 on 19<sup>th</sup> July. We will continue with our current bubble arrangements until the end of term to minimise any impact on families going away on holiday. From September, we will no longer be operating in bubbles or require social distancing. Parents will not need to wear face covering on site. We will review our risk assessment for September; we will still be taking sensible measures to keep our children and staff safe as we learn to live with Covid 19.

Thank you to all parents who have complied with the Government regulations by taking children with Covid-related symptoms and their siblings out of school for PCR testing. I know that all cases so far have turned out to be colds and it is a huge inconvenience for parents – but we have got this far without having to close

any bubbles and I really appreciate you acting to protect our whole school community from any potential cases — especially this close to the end of term. Please note that a lateral flow test is only for asymptomatic cases and cannot be used for a child with any symptoms. Further details are below.

We will be holding a mufti day on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> July in celebration of the England team reaching the UEFA European Football Championship final. Pupils may wear red and white clothes or football kits and we would welcome donations of £1 towards new sports equipment.

# **Covid Testing and Symptoms - Reminder**

We are pleased that so far we haven't had to close any class bubbles at Holly Lodge and want to keep it that way. If your child displays any of the Covid symptoms, you will need to arrange a Covid test. I realise that this may inconvenience parents, but by doing this you are protecting all of our children and our families. The three main symptoms are a new, persistent cough, change in sense of smell or taste, raised temperature. **Even if your child displays only one of these symptoms, you will still need to arrange a test.** 

We would like to remind parents that lateral flow device (LFD) tests are not sufficient for use when children are displaying Covid symptoms. These are designed for asymptomatic testing only and cannot be used in lieu of a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test. Unfortunately, we cannot accept symptomatic pupils back to school unless they have a negative PCR test.
