Please may I remind all families to take care when entering and exiting school. Please use the pedestrian entrance, not the vehicle entrance and exit. The morning kiss and drop drive through for


junior children is working really well at the moment and we want to keep all pedestrians safe by ensuring those on foot use the pedestrian gate only.

Attendance and Punctuality Update

We would like to remind you that school registration for the day is at 08.50am. Children are expected to be in class ready at this time. In order to facilitate this, the school gates are open at 08.30am, giving your child plenty of time for their transition in to the school day. If you arrive once the gates are shut, you *must* sign your child in via the office for Safeguarding reasons. Late arrivals at school have several repercussions.

- He/she misses out on essential instructions given at the beginning of lessons in fact, arriving 10 minutes late each day adds up to missing 1 1/2 weeks of school by the end of the year
- Pupils may feel awkward and embarrassed going into the classroom when everyone else is already settled
- When one person arrives late everyone loses out the class is disrupted and the teacher must take time away from the other pupils to explain what is going on for the lesson

If your child arrives after 9.10am then they are classed as missing that session, and this will have a direct effect on their attendance percentage. Punctuality is monitored closely, and if we feel that there is an issue, we will communicate this to yourself.

If your child's attendance becomes a cause for concern, whether this is because there have been multiple absences through illness or other reasons, we will let you know. If you have any concerns in regards to attendance, then please do not hesitate to contact me via the school office
